N. 87° 16' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over nearly level land, through scattered sagebrush and greasewood.

5.70 Trail road, bears ENE. and WSW.

The 4 sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, monumented with a wooden post, 4 ins. square, 4 ft. long, firmly set 10 ins. in the ground. This position is harmoniously related to existing original corners and is accepted as the best existing evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

reset the wooden post and set a steel fence post, $5\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 22 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post.

N. 89° 44' W., beginning new measurement.

Over nearly level land.
