GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area surveyed within Township 11 North, Range 61 East, varies from nearly level in the western portion to rolling in the eastern portion. The elevation ranges from about 5,400 to 7,000 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy loam on the lower elevations to gravelly and rocky on the higher elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood, rabbitbrush and shadscale with scattered pinon and juniper on the higher elevation.

The area drains in a westerly direction. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Access into the area is provided by State Highway No. 38, crossing the township in a southerly direction and improved and unimproved roads. Principal users of the area are cattlemen.
