	N. 0° 29' W., bet. secs. 1 and 6.
	Descend over NE. slope, through sagebrush, pinon and juniper.
39.77	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
	Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

40.30	Ravine, drains E.; ascend over S. slope.
69.50	Spur, slopes NE.; descend over NE. slope.
79.54	The cor. of Tps. 36 and 37 N., Rs. 63 and 64 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set in mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 16 ins. high, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the resurvey of T. 37 N., R. 64 E., resurveyed concurrently under this same group.
GENERAL DESCRIPTION	
The land along the portion of the south boundary and the east boundary varies from about 6400 to 7500 ft. above sea level and is generally mountainous. The soil is rocky and clay loam. The vegetation consists principally of sagebrush, cheat grass, juniper, and pinon.	
The principal use of the area is grazing of livestock.	
No mineral formations were noted during the survey.
