Stewart, Deputy Surveyor, in 1883.</div> <div>The cor. of Tps. 37 and 38 N., Rs. 63 and 64 E., monu- mented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., exposed 10 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the W. bdy. of T. 37 N., R. 64 E., executed under this same group.</div> <div>N. 69° 56' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.</div> <div>Over rolling land, through juniper and pinon.</div> <div>21.00 Spur, slopes SW.; desc. 100 ft. over a W. slope.</div> <div>32.50 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at propor- tionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</div> <div>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</div> <div><div>T38N R63E ¼ S 36 S 1 T37N</div><div>1977</div><div>raise a mound of stone, 3½ ft. base, 2½ ft. high, N. of cor.</div></div> <div>33.00 Ravine, drains SW.; over rolling SW. slope.</div> <div>65.00 The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, monumented with a mound of stone. No marked stone found.
