The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6, T. 35 N., R. 65 E., monumented with an aluminum post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 6 ins. above ground, with aluminum cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 35 N., R. 65 E., resurveyed concurrently under this same group.

Intersect the Seventh Standard Parallel North.

The closing cor. of Tps. 35 N., Rs. 64 and 65 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 in. diam., firmly set and exposed 5 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 35 N., R. 65 E., executed under Group No. 26.

From this corner, the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 36 N., R. 64 E., monumented with an aluminum post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 6 ins. above ground, with aluminum cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 36 N., R. 64 E., resurveyed concurrently under this same group, bears S. $89^{\circ} 25'$ W., 12.53 chs. dist.

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE WEST BOUNDARY,
T. 35 N., R. 64 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by U.S. Deputy Surveyors J.C. Smyles and C.S. Preble, in 1881.

A double set of corners were found on this line. The local surveyor monuments were in general appearance established at a much later date than when the original survey was made.

From the cor. of Tps. 34 and 35 N., Rs. 63 and 64 E., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 6 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 34 N., R. 63 E., resurveyed under Group No. 522.

N. $0^{\circ} 22'$ W., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over nearly level land, through greasewood.

Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.
