

TOWNSHIP 29 NORTH, RANGE 64 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

The following field notes are those of the dependent resurvey of the boundaries and subdivisional lines of T. 29 N., R. 64 E.

The boundaries and subdivisional lines were surveyed by Charles Preble and James Thorburn, U.S. Deputy Surveyors. The boundaries were surveyed in 1881 under Contract No. 130 and the subdivisional lines in 1882 under Contract No. 141.

Before restoring the corners, the lines of the original survey were retraced and diligent search made for any evidence of the original corners and other calls of the original field note record.

The rules of proportionate measurement were applied in order to ascertain the position of lost corners, after completing the necessary retracements to connect with the identified corner locations. In order to simplify the record, the true line notes only are supplied herewith, which refer to the completed resurvey.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions 1973, and the Special Instructions dated March 22, 1976 and the Supplemental Special Instructions dated September 23, 1976.

The directions of the lines of this resurvey were determined by azimuth taken from U.S.C. & G.S. triangulation station "COTTON", located in sec. 6, T. 28 N., R. 64 E.

The geographic position for the southeast corner of the township is at latitude $40^{\circ} 20' 28''$ N., and longitude $114^{\circ} 41' 38''$ W., as calculated along section lines from the U.S.C. & G.S. triangulation station "COTTON".

The mean magnetic declination was found to be 17° E.

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SOUTH BOUNDARY

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
Charles Preble and James Thorburn, U.S. Deputy Surveyors,
in 1881.

From the cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 N., Rs. 64 and 65 E., monumented with a steel pipe, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., exposed 12 ins. above the ground, this is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner, with plate on top mkd. SE COR T29N R64E FWM & SON.
