

DEPENDENT RESUVEY OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,
T. 27 N., R. 67 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS	GENERAL DESCRIPTION
	The land within Township 27 North, Range 67 East, ranges from about 6,300 to 7,200 ft. above sea level, and is nearly level to rolling and mountainous. The Antelope Mountain Range extends into the southwest portion of the township. The soil varies from sandy clay to gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood, whitesage and shadscale with juniper and pinon in the higher elevations. The township is drained by Boone Canyon which drains northerly through the western portion of the township and Kingsley Draw which drains northerly in the eastern portion and other minor drainages throughout the township. The Boone Spring is located in section 29 and Itcaina Well with two storage tanks is located in section 25. Principal users of the area are cattlemen and sheepmen. Access into the township is provided by U.S. Highway, Alternate No. 50, which enters the township on the south boundary of sec. 31 and leaves on the north boundary of sec. 4 and by desert trail roads throughout the township.
