The Dolly Varden Mountain range extends into the northwest portion of the township. The soil varies from sandy clay to gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood, white-sage and shadscale with scattered juniper and pinon in the higher elevations.</p> <p>The township is drained by numerous dry washes draining easterly throughout the township.</p> <p>The Dolly Varden Spring is located in section 9, and there is a well with windmill and storage tank in section 33.</p> <p>No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen and sheepmen. Access into the township is provided by U.S. Highway, Alternate No. 50, which enters the township on the south boundary of section 33 and leaves on the east boundary of section 13, and by desert trail roads.</p>
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
