	GENERAL DESCRIPTION
	<p>The area surveyed and resurveyed is situated about 50 miles SSE. of Elko, Nevada. The elevation ranges from about 6,000 ft. to 6,400 ft. above sea level. Aspen timber is located along creeks; the undergrowth consists of willows and buckbrush along the creeks, with sagebrush and sparse amounts of native grasses in the remainder of the area. Drainage to the area is provided by Overland Creek, which provides water for numerous irrigation ditches, and drains generally in a southeasterly direction.</p>
	<p>No mineral deposits of value were noted.</p>
	<p>Access to the area is provided by one main dirt road, coming from the north and continuing SSW. Further access is provided by numerous jeep trails located throughout the area.</p>
	<p>The mean magnetic declination is 17° E.</p>
