

T. 34 N., R. 58 E., Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada

CHAINS

The following field notes are those of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the subdivisional lines and the subdivision of section 20, Township 34 North, Range 58 East, Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada.

The boundaries and the subdivisional lines were surveyed in 1868-1869 by C.C. Tracy, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, as shown on the official plat of survey, approved September 16, 1869.

The survey was executed in accordance with specifications set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973, and the Special Instructions for Group No. 536, Nevada, dated March 30, 1976.

The directions of all lines were determined by altitude observations on the sun and refer to the true meridian.

Prior to restoration of any corners, all necessary lines of the original survey were retraced and diligent search was made for any evidence of the original monuments and other calls of the official record. Identified corners were remonumented in their original positions; lost corners were restored and remonumented at proportionate positions based on the official record. The retracement data were thoroughly verified and only the true line field notes are given herein.

The geographic position of the cor. of secs. 20, 21, 28, and 29, as scaled from the U.S.G.S. 7½ minute series, "HALLECK SW., NEVADA.", quadrangle map is:

Latitude 40° 48.5' N. Longitude 115° 27.0' W.

The mean magnetic declination is 17° E.

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the Subdivisional Lines,
T. 34 N., R. 58 E., Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada

(Restoring the 1868-1869 survey by C.C. Tracy)

Beginning at the cor. of secs. 20, 21, 28, and 29, determined at the intersection of fences, extending N. and E. This point has long been recognized as the cor. by the adjacent land owner and is accepted as the best available evidence of the original cor.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Set a steel fence post alongside the iron post.

N. 0° 29' E., bet. secs. 20 and 21.

Over nearly level land, through dense sagebrush.
