	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The area resurveyed and surveyed is situated about 55 miles southeast of Elko, Nevada. The average elevation is about 6,400 ft. above sea level, with very little change. The soil is sandy loam. The area is drained by several small creeks and small irrigation ditches, which drain generally E. In the westerly portion of the area there is a small amount of juniper and mountain mahogany, and in the southeast portion of the area there are some small aspens, none of which are of any commercial value. The undergrowth consists mainly of sagebrush, with some scattering willows, buckthorn and native grasses.</p> <p>No mineral deposits of value were noted.</p> <p>Access to the area is provided by one main dirt road and several small dirt jeep trails.</p> <p>The mean magnetic declination is $17\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E.</p>
