DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE NORTH BOUNDARY,  
T. 36 N., R. 58 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by  
Charles C. Tracy, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1869.

The cor. of Tps. 36 and 37 N., Rs. 58 and 59 E., monumented with an aluminum post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 6 ins. above ground, with aluminum cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 36 N., R. 59 E., executed concurrently under this same group.

S. 89° 43' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over gently rolling land, covered with sagebrush.

21.00 Trail road, bears N. and S.

40.19 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, and proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, 24 ins. in the ground, alongside the aluminum post.

50.00 Winter Creek, 70 lks. wide, 3 ft. deep, course S.

65.00 Trail road, bears SW. and NE., soon N.

66.50 Fence cor., bears NORTH, 0.48 chs. dist., from which fences bear N. and W.; along S. side of fence.

68.30 Draw, drains S.

80.38 The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, monumented with an iron pipe, 37 ins. long, ½ in. diam., firmly set and exposed 18 ins. above ground, alongside a steel fence post, firmly set and exposed 4 ft. above ground at fence cor. from which fences bear E. and S. and recorded by Harry Fuller, U.S. BLM Range Conservationist Technician, in 1962. Harry Fuller determined the corner position from the remains of the original willow post which no longer exists.
