DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE EAST BOUNDARY,
T. 37 N., R. 58 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
C.C. Tracy, U.S. Deputy Surveyor,
in 1869.

The cor. of Tps. 36 and 37 N., Rs. 58 and 59 E., monumented with an aluminum post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 6 ins. above ground, with aluminum cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 36 N., R. 59 E., executed concurrently under this same group.

N. 0° 20' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over gently rolling land, covered with sagebrush.

40.60 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, 22 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post.

75.70 Trail road, bears E. and W.

81.20 The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, monumented with a pine post, 4x4x34 ins. long, wired to a steel fence post, firmly set and exposed 4 ft. above ground. This point is harmoniously related to other existing original corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
