The standard corner of secs. 32 and 33, T. 36 N., R. 59 E. monumented with a rebar, ½ in. diam., 14 ins. long, firmly set and exposed 1 in. above ground in a fence bearing E. and W. This position is harmoniously related to other existing original corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., $2\frac{1}{4}$ ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
