<p>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land within the portion resurveyed of Township 36 North, Range 59 East, ranges from about 5300 to 5500 ft. above sea level and is mostly gently rolling with the exception of nearly level grass meadows along the Humboldt River. The soil varies from silt loam along the Humboldt River to sandy clay loam away from the Humboldt River. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, native grasses and willows along the Humboldt River, and crested wheatgrass in the reseeded secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32.</p> <p>The township is drained by Reed Creek, entering in sec. 34 and draining in a generally northwest direction until it empties into the Humboldt River in the northwest portion of the township. Access is provided by Interstate 80 crossing the northwest corner of sec. 6 and some trail roads in the part of the township south of the Humboldt River.</p> <p>The Western Pacific Railroad track runs along the south side of the Humboldt River and crosses sec. 7 in a northeasterly direction. The Southern Pacific Railroad track and Interstate Highway 80 run along the north side of the Humboldt River and cross sec. 6 in a northeasterly direction.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are people in the cattle industry. No mineral activity of consequence was noted during the survey.</p>
