DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SOUTH BOUNDARY,
T. 37 N., R. 59 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
C.C. Tracy, U.S. Deputy Surveyor,
in 1869.

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 33, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with a wooden stake, 1x2x16 ins. long, firmly set and exposed 4 ins. above ground and in a fence, bearing N. and S. This point is harmoniously related to other existing original corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

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 $\frac{1}{4}$ $\frac{S\ 33}{S\ 4}$
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bury the wooden stake alongside the iron post.

N. $89^{\circ} 26'$ W., bet. secs. 4 and 33.

Over nearly level meadow land.

10.00 Humboldt River, 50 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course SE.

40.72 Point for the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 6 ins. below the surface of the ground, with brass cap mkd.
