

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,
T. 37 N., R. 59 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS	
	N. 89° 18' W., beginning new measurement.
	Over gently rolling land, through sagebrush.
23.30	Trail road, bears NNE. and SSW.
40.10	The cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, on the W. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 37 N., R. 58 E., executed concurrently under this same group.
	From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8.
	N. 0° 37' E., bet. secs. 5 and 6.
	Over gently rolling land, through sagebrush.
31.00	Trail road on ridge, bears E. and W.
40.83	Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
	Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

	set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, 22 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post.
81.28	The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the N. bdy. of the Tp.
	GENERAL DESCRIPTION
	The land resurveyed within Township 37 North, Range 59 East, ranges from about 5,300 to 5,700 ft. above sea level and varies from gently rolling to nearly level along the river bottom. The soil varies from sandy clay loam on the higher elevations to sandy loam on the bottom land. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, willows and native grasses.
	The township is drained by the Marys River, which enters the township in sec. 1 and flows southerly to the Humboldt River, which enters the township in sec. 25 and flows WSW. and leaves the township in sec. 33.
	The Western Pacific and Southern Pacific Railroads pass through the southeastern portion of the township. Interstate 80 passes diagonally through the southern portion of the township.
	There are water wells located in secs. 6, 15 and 18. A radio tower is located in sec. 32. Death is located in secs. 25 and 26. Principal users of the area are cattlemen. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the resurvey.
