CHAINS

The closing corner of secs. 5 and 6, monumented with a quartzite stone, 15x10x8 ins., plainly mkd. with 5 notches on the E. edge and 1 notch on the W. edge and CC on the S. face, firmly set and exposed 7 ins. above ground, with a mound of stone, S. of cor.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 8 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

bury the original cornerstone alongside the iron post.

Point for the N. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6, is at proportionate distance and on the S. bdy. of sec. 31.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 16 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area resurveyed within Township 41 North, Range 54 East, varies from gently rolling land in the eastern portion of the township to mountainous land in the western portion. The elevation varies from 6,500 to 7,500 ft. above sea level. The soil consists of sandy clay and rocky at the higher elevations, to sandy loam at the lower elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, meadow grass and other sparse native grasses. There are scattered stands of aspen at the higher elevations.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey. Access into the township is provided with numerous unimproved roads.
