Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
U.S. Deputy Surveyor H.B. Maxson,
in 1900.

From the corner of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, Tps. 42 and
43 N., R. 54 E., monumented with a red sandstone,
12x8x4 ins., mkd. with 3 grooves on E. face and 3 grooves
on W. face, firmly set and exposed 6 ins. above ground.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

bury the original cornerstone alongside the iron post
and raise a mound of stone, 3½ ft. base, 2½ ft. high,
W. of cor.

S. 89° 41' W., bet. secs. 4 and 33.

Over nearly level land; asc. 80 ft. over an E. slope to
¼ sec. cor.

- 0.03 Fence, bears N. and S.
- 39.50 Gravel road, bears E. and W., irregular.
- 40.10 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 33, at propor-
tionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the
original corner. This corner now refers to 33 only.

Set a copper-coated steel stake, 24 ins. long, ½ in.
diam., 12 ins. below the surface of the ground in the
N. borrow pit of road, with top mkd.
