
DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE EAST BOUNDARY,
T. 43 N., R. 54 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed by U.S. Deputy Surveyors A.J. Hatch & J.H. Eaton, in 1870, and the Resurvey Executed by U.S. Deputy Surveyor H.B. Maxson, in 1900.

The cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, T. 43 N., Rs. 54 and 55 E., monumented with a basalt stone, 16x8x8 ins., dimly mkd. with 5 notches on the S. edge and 1 notch on the N. edge, firmly set in a mound of stone.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 14 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

bury the original cornerstone and set a steel fence post, 6 ft. long, 14 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post.


N. 1° 52' W., bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Over rolling land, through sagebrush and bunchgrass; asc. 40 ft. over a rolling S. slope.

28.00 Trail road, bears NE. and SW.

39.92 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

set a steel fence post, 6 ft. long, 22 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post.

Ascend 140 ft. over a rolling S. slope.

60.50 Spur, slopes SE.; asc. 30 ft. over a SE. slope.
