

TOWNSHIP 43 NORTH, RANGE 54 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area resurveyed within Township 43 North, Range 54 East, varies from gently rolling land in the southeast portion to mountainous land in the remaining portion of the township. The elevation ranges from 6,300 to 7,800 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay and rocky at the higher elevations to black loam at the lower elevations. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, meadow grass and other sparse native grasses. There are scattered stands of aspens at the higher elevations.

The township is drained by two major drains. The North Fork Humboldt River drains the southern portion, which flows southeast. Deep Creek drains the central and northeast portion which flows northeast.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by improved and unimproved roads. No mineral formations of any consequence was noted during the survey.
