CHAINS

Point for the N. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6 is on the S. bdy. of sec. 36, T. 31 N., R. 67 E., and at 40.00 chs. in departure from the closing cor. of secs. 5 and 6.

Set an aluminum post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 14 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base to top, with aluminum cap mkd.

From this corner, the standard cor. of Tps. 31 N., Rs. 67 and 68 E., bears S. $88^{\circ} 43'$ E., 9.42 chs. dist.

From this same corner, the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 31 N., R. 67 E., bears N. $88^{\circ} 43'$ W., 30.52 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 30 North, Range 68 East, ranges from about 5600 ft. to 9800 ft. above sea level and is gently rolling to mountainous. This township is situated on the Goshute mountain range. The soil is mostly sandy clay loam and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, budsage and bunch grass in the lower elevation and fir, bristlecone pine, pinon, juniper, mountain mahogany and bunch grass in the mountains.

The township is drained by minor dry washes throughout the township.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by unimproved roads. No mining activity of consequence was noted during the survey.
