Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by  
U.S. Deputy Surveyors T.K. Stewart and E.C. McClellan,  
in 1884,  
and Resurveyed by  
U.S. Deputy Surveyors L.H. Taylor and W.A. Keddie,  
in 1903.

The cor. of Tps. 41 and 42 N., R. 52 E., monumented with  
an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed  
6 ins. above the ground, with brass cap marked as  
described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey  
of the east boundary of T. 41 N., R. 52 E., executed  
concurrently under this same group.

N. 0° 07' E., along the E. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over mountainous land, covered with sagebrush, along  
a fence; desc. 320 ft. over a N. slope.

17.00 Boyd Creek, 20 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course NW.: asc.  
200 ft. over a SW. slope.

25.47 Point for the W. ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 42 N.,  
R. 53 E., is on the E. bdy. of sec. 36 and at midpoint  
between the closing corners.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
