Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by  
U.S. Deputy Surveyors A.J. Hatch and J.H. Eaton,  
in 1871,  
U.S. Deputy Surveyors T.K. Stewart and E.C. McClellan,  
in 1884  
and Resurvey of U.S. Deputy Surveyor H.B. Maxson,  
in 1900.

From the cor. of Tps. 42 and 43 N., R. 52 E., monumented  
with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam. firmly set and exposed  
6 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described  
in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the east  
boundary of T. 42 N., R. 52 E., executed concurrently  
under this same group.

N. 0° 40' W., along the E. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over mountainous land, covered with sagebrush and aspens.

0.50 Top of ridge, bears NE. and SW.; desc. 20 ft. over a  
NE. slope.

2.815 Point for the S. 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 43 N.,  
R. 53 E.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

set a slate stone, 12x8x4 ins., 7 ins. in the ground,  
mkd. with an "X", alongside the iron post.

Descent 350 ft. over a NE. slope.

22.98 Point for the W. ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 43 N.,  
R. 53 E., is on the E. bdy. of sec. 36 and at midpoint  
between the closing corners.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
