	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>Several springs are situated in the west half of Township 37 North, Range 66 East. The area varies from gently rolling in the eastern portion to mountainous in the western portion. The elevation ranges from about 5,800 to 7,400 ft. above sea level. The soil is usually sandy clay loam in the rolling land and changing to a rocky loam in higher elevations. The vegetation consists of shadscale, sagebrush, cheatgrass, juniper, and pinon.</p> <p>Interstate 80 crosses the SW. portion of the Township, Nevada State Highway 30, crosses the SE. portion of the Township. Further access into the Township is provided by numerous secondary and desert trail roads.</p> <p>East Squaw Creek drains the Township, which flows southeast from near the west boundary of section 7 to the east boundary of section 25.</p> <p>The Squaw Creek Ranch is located in section 10. A radio station is situated in section 18. An airway beacon is situated in section 19.</p> <p>Principal use of the Township is grazing. No mineral formations of any consequence were noted.</p>
