Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by D.H. Barker  
and J.H. Eaton, U.S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1880.

From the cor. of Tps. 37 and 38 N., Rs. 66 and 67 E.,  
monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set  
and exposed 6 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd.  
as described in the field notes of the resurvey of  
T. 37 N., R. 66 E., executed concurrently under this  
same group.

N. 1° 08' W., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over nearly level land, through scattered sagebrush and  
greasewood.

40.03 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at propor-  
tionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the  
original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins.  
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
