DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SOUTH BOUNDARY
T. 13 N., R. 43 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed
by U.S. Deputy Surveyors
A.J. Hatch, D.H. Barker and E.L. Bridges, in 1873.

The cor. of Tps. 12 and 13 N., Rs. 43 and 44 E., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 6 ins. above the ground, mkd. as described in the field notes of the concurrent resurvey of T. 12 N., R. 44 E.

S. 89° 01' W. bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over nearly level land, through sagebrush.

39.88 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

62.20 Wash, 40 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains N.

79.76 The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, monumented with a juniper post, 2 ins. square, 28 ins. long, no scribe marks visible, loosely set in a mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
