GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area resurveyed within Township 25 North, Range 20 East, is mountainous. The elevation is about 8,000 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy clay loam and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, buckbrush, bunch-grass and large patches of aspen trees are located on most of the north slopes.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by trail roads. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
