

TOWNSHIP 8 NORTH, RANGE 39 EAST, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

The following field notes are those of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the east and north boundaries and a portion of the subdivisional lines of Township 8 North, Range 39 East, Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada.

The boundaries and subdivisional lines were surveyed by Glover and Perrin, U.S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1880 and 1881 under Contract No. 102.

Before restoring the corners, the lines of the original surveys were retraced and diligent search made for any evidence of the original corners and other calls of the original field note record.

The rules of proportionate measurement were applied in order to ascertain the position of lost corners, after completing the necessary retracements to connect with the identified corner locations. In order to simplify the record, the true line notes only are supplied herewith which refer to the completed survey.

The survey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973, and the Special Instructions dated July 27, 1977.

The directions of the lines of this resurvey were determined by azimuth taken from U-71-2, which is a tellurometer traverse station, occupied under Group No. 389, Nevada, which is at latitude $38^{\circ} 35' 34.971''$ N. and longitude $117^{\circ} 38' 39.843''$ W., and supplemented by altitude observations of the sun, and carried forward by sustained angulation throughout the progress of the resurvey.

The geographic position for the southeast corner of section 12, is at latitude $38^{\circ} 33' 49''$ N. and longitude $117^{\circ} 32' 00''$ W., as calculated from U-71-2, the previously named tellurometer traverse station.

The magnetic declination was found to be 17° E.

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
Glover and Perrin, U.S. Deputy Surveyors,
in 1880.

The original cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13 and 18, monumented with a granite stone, 15x10x8 ins., firmly set and exposed 10 ins. above the ground, in a mound of stone, plainly mkd. 4 notches on S. edge and 2 notches on N. edge.
