in 1880 and Resurveyed by
U. S. Surveyor N. E. Potter in 1914.

From the standard cor. of Tps. 36 N., Rs. 65 and 66 E.,
monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set
showing 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as
described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey
of the Seventh Standard Parallel North, executed under
Group No. 26.

N. 89° 47' W., along the S. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over mountainous land, covered with mountain mahogany,
douglas fir, choke cherry and bunch grass.

31.43 The closing cor. of Tps. 35 N., Rs. 65 and 66 E.,
monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set
showing 14 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as
described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey
of T. 35 N., R. 65 E., executed under Group No. 26.

39.93 The standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36, monumented with an
iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set showing 12 ins. above
ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field
notes of the dependent resurvey of the Seventh Standard
Parallel North, executed under Group No. 26.

monumented with juniper post, 4 ins. square, 4 ft. long,
firmly set in a mound of earth, with illegible scribe
marks visible.
