## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area resurveyed within Township 36 North, Range 66 East, varies from mountainous in the west portion to gently rolling in the central and east portion. The elevation ranges from about 5,600 to 8,000 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay loam and rocky on the higher elevations to sandy clay loam in the lower elevations. The vegetation consists of juniper, pinon, bitterbrush and bunch grass in the higher elevation to sagebrush, shadscale, meadow grass and native grasses in the bottom land.

The town of Oasis is located in the southeast portion of section 2. Big Springs Ranch is located in sections 28 and 33.

Interstate 80 enters the township on the north boundary of section 3 and leaves on the east boundary of section 13. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
