GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 36 North, Range 67 East, ranges from about 5,600 to 6,300 ft. above sea level and is nearly level to rolling. The soil is sandy clay loam. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood and native grass.

The Nevada Northern Railroad runs through the western portion of the township and Interstate Highway No. 80 cuts through the southwest portion of the township in a SE. and NW. direction.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by Interstate Highway No. 80 and trail roads throughout the township.
