The cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36, monumented with a cottonwood post, 4 ins. square, 40 ins. long, wired to a steel fence post, firmly set in the ground. This is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

reset the wooden post and the steel fence post, 6 ft. long, 22 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post.

N. 0° 07' E., bet. secs. 25 and 26.

40.25 Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 26, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
