	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land within Township 12 North, Range 43 East, ranges from about 5500 to 5700 ft. above sea level, and is nearly level to rolling. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood, rabbitbrush, shadscale and native grass.</p> <p>The North and South forks of the Twin Rivers drain easterly through the township.</p> <p>The Nevada State Highway No. 8A, crosses the township from N. to S., in the west tier of sections. Further access into the township is provided by numerous improved and unimproved desert trail roads throughout the township.</p> <p>The R.O. Ranch is located in sections 2, 3, 4, 8, 9, 10 and 11.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p>
