The soil in the eastern portion of the township is a sandy clay loam and the western portion being of a gravel nature to rocky.</p> <p>The Western Pacific Railroad crosses through the township from E. to SW.</p> <p>The Nevada Northern Railroad crosses through the township from E. to SSW.</p> <p>There are numerous trail roads throughout the township, and the area is covered with shadscale, sagebrush and bunchgrass.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen and ranchers.
