The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, monumented with a juniper post, 30 ins. long, 2 ins. square, with visible scribe marks, and firmly set 10 ins. in the ground.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
