The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set showing 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 35 N., R. 67 E., executed concurrently under this same group.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The eastern portion of the township is situated in the low foothills of the Toana Range, the remainder is in the Goshute Valley. The elevation varies from 5,600 to 6,700 ft. above sea level. The soil consists of a sandy clay loam with scattered rock outcroppings. The vegetation varies from greasewood in the western portion in the valley to whitesage with scattered juniper in the eastern portion in the foothills. Shafter Knoll is located on the south boundary of the township, and several smaller outcroppings are located in the northern portion.

The Nevada Northern Railroad crosses the western portion, and the Western Pacific railroad crosses the northwestern portion of the township, with a small switching area at Shafter in section 6. There are numerous trail roads and jeep trails throughout the township.

Wells are located in sections 16 and 22. An old cemetery is located near the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 18.

The principal users of the township are cattlemen. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during this survey.
