Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
N. E. Potter, U. S. Surveyor
in 1914.

The standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 36 N., R. 67 E.,
monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set
showing 12 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as
described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey
of T. 36 N., R. 67 E., executed under Group No. 26.

Remark the brass cap to read:

S. 89° 56' W., along the S. bdy. of sec. 36, T. 36 N.,
R. 67 E.

Over gently rolling land, covered with sagebrush,
scattered juniper and pinon.

36.62 The N $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 1, hereinafter described.

40.45 The standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36, monumented with an
iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone,
with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of
the dependent resurvey of T. 36 N., R. 67 E., executed
under Group No. 26.

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SOUTH BOUNDARY,
T. 35 N., R. 67 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
U.S. Deputy Surveyors J.C. Smyles and C.S. Preble
in 1881.

The cor. of Tps. 34 and 35 N., R. 67 E., monumented with
an iron post, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set in a mound
of stone, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field
notes of T. 34 N., R. 67 E., resurveyed concurrently
under this same group.

S. 74° 20' W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over mountainous land, covered with sagebrush,
bunchgrass and scattered juniper.

Descend over a SW. slope.

30.55 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at
proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence
of the original corner.
