GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within Township 35 North, Range 67 East, ranges from about 5,500 to 7,400 ft. above sea level. The soil in the western portion of the township is a sandy clay loam and the eastern postion being of a gravel nature to rocky.

There are numerous trail roads throughout the township. A good gravel road crosses the township from the Shafter Exit of Interstate 80 to the town of Shafter. The Western Pacific Railroad enters the township in sec. 12 and leaves in sec. 31. The Nevada Northern Railroad enters the township in sec. 6 and leaves in sec. 31.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen and ranchers. There were no mineral formations of consequence noted during the survey.
