

T. 16 N., R. 63 E., Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

That portion of T. 16 N., R. 63 E., pertinent to this survey lies in the southern portion of and at the southeast outskirts of the town of Ely, Nevada. The elevation varies from 6,400 to 6,700 feet above mean sea level.

The drainages are generally northerly and northeasterly with the most pronounced being Murry Canyon at the western side of the project. The topography is mostly gently rolling.

Vegetation is light, consisting of small coniferous trees, sagebrush, and various grasses and herbs.

U.S. Highway Nos. 6, 50, and 93 pass through the east edge of the project. U.S. Highway No. 6 also passes through the western portion. The proximity to town accounts for the fact that there are numerous man-made objects in the area, including roads of varying quality, power lines, buildings, a gravel pit, and an auto raceway.

The mean magnetic declination is $16\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E.
