CHAINS

S. 88° 31' W., bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Over rolling land, through medium sagebrush and bunchgrass.

38.98 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

set a steel fence post, 6 ft. long, 22 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post.

79.08 The cor. of Tps. 38 and  $38\frac{1}{2}$  N., R. 64 E., monumented with the remains of a juniper post, in a mound of stone. This position is harmoniously related to other existing original corners and is accepted as the best remaining evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to cap, with brass cap mkd.

From the cor. of Tps. 37 and 38 N., Rs. 63 and 64 E., monumented with an iron post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 7 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 37 N., R. 64 E., resurveyed under Group No. 533.
