B 347 1953, bears S. 87° 50' E., 35.99 chs. dist.</p> <p>The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, 31 and 32, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 6 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 39 N., R. 65 E., executed concurrently under this same Group.</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The land within Township 38 North, Range 65 East, is situated on the north end of the Pequop Mountain Range, and is mostly rolling mountainous land. The elevation ranges from about 6,100 to 8,100 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy clay loam and rocky. The vegetation consists of mostly sagebrush and bitterbrush, with juniper and pinon in the higher elevation.</p> <p>The Southern Pacific Railroad crosses through the north portion of the township.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by improved and unimproved dirt roads. There was no mining activity of any consequence noted during the survey.</p> <hr/>	
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
