GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area resurveyed within Township 10 North, Range 46 East, varies from mountainous and gently rolling in the western portion to nearly level in the eastern portion. The elevation ranges from about 6,900 to 7,600 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay loam and rocky on the higher elevations to black loam on the bottom land. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, Brigham tea, rabbitbrush, meadowgrass and other native grasses. There are scattered juniper and pinon trees on the eastern slopes. Barley Creek is the main water source and is located along the west boundary of the township. The other water sources are several small creeks in the south end of the township. All the creeks eventually go underground in the middle of the valley. A windmill is located in sec. 12. Stone House Ranch (abandoned) is located in sec. 12. Reseeded areas are located in secs. 33 and 34. Meadows that are apparently only used for grazing are found in parts of secs. 1, 12, 13, 27 and 28. The principal users of the township are people in the cattle industry.

Access is provided by an improved gravel road, Nevada State Highway No. 82, which enters the township in sec. 34, going in a northeasterly direction, curves back to the west and exits in sec. 2. There are other numerous trail roads.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
