

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE
SECOND STANDARD PARALLEL NORTH,
THROUGH A PORTION OF R. 46, MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS
39.74

The standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 33, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 11 N., R. 46 E., executed under Group No. 175, from which the original bearing trees:

A pinon pine, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 43° E., 146 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S33 SC BT on a partially healed blaze.

A pinon pine, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W., 62 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S33 SC BT on a partially healed blaze.

Remark the brass cap as follows:

N. 0° 59' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over nearly level land, covered with native grass.

39.52 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, monumented with the decayed remains of a wooden post, 2 ins. square, 14 ins. long, with no scribe marks visible, loosely set in a mound of earth.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
