Bury the cornerstone and set a steel fence post, $5\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 2 ft. in the ground, alongside the iron post.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land resurveyed within Township 12 North, Range 46 East, ranges from about 6800 to 7000 ft. above sea level, and is nearly level to rolling. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, rabbitbrush, greasewood, shadscale and whitesage.

There are scattered juniper and pinon on the higher elevations of little commercial value.

The township is drained by numerous dry washes draining easterly through the township.

Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by State Route No. 82, which crosses northeasterly through the area. There are numerous other improved and unimproved desert trail roads.

There is a mill and mining activity in section 9.
