T. 16 N., R. 44 E., MDM, NEVADA CHAINS GENERAL DESCRIPTION The land within Township 16 North, Range 44 East, ranges from about 5500 to 7200 ft. above sea level, and is nearly level to rolling and mountainous. The soil is sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, greasewood, rabbitbrush, shadscale and native grass. There are scattered juniper, pinon and mahogany on the higher elevations of little commercial value. Kingston and Santa Fe Creeks, drain easterly to the Young Ranch in sections 16 and 21. The town of Kingston is located partially in section 31.Principal users of the area are cattlemen. Access into the township is provided by Nevada State Highway No. 8A, which enters the township on the south boundary of section 32 and leaves on the north boundary of section 2, and supplemented by numerous improved and unimproved desert trail roads. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
