	<p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T7N R41E R42E $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 S 6</p> <p style="text-align: center;">1979</p> <p>set a steel fence post, $5\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 24 ins. in the ground, alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.</p> <hr/> <p>N. $0^{\circ} 29'$ E., beginning new measurement.</p> <p>Over gently rolling land.</p>
38.60	Trail road, bears WNW. and ESE.

Bridges, U.S. Deputy Surveyors, in 1873.</p> <hr/> <p>From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set showing 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of T. 7 N., R. 43 E., executed under Group No. 260. Remark brass cap as follows:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T8N R42E $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 S 1 T7N</p> <p style="text-align: center;">1979 1939</p> <p>N. $89^{\circ} 38'$ W., bet. secs. 1 and 36.</p> <p>Over nearly level land, covered with medium shadscale, greasewood, scattered Mormon tea, rabbitbrush and native grass.</p>
40.48	The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, monumented with a decayed wooden post, 4 ft. long, 2 ins. square, with no scribe marks visible, firmly set 18 ins. in a mound of earth.
