DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES, T. 7 N., R. 42 E., MDM, NEVADA

CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within the portion resurveyed of Township 7 North, Range 42 East, ranges from about 5,400 to 5,500 ft. above sea level and is nearly level to rolling. The soil is sandy to sandy clay loam. The vegetation consists of greasewood, shadscale, Mormon tea, creoste bush, rabbitbrush, sagebrush and native grass.

Principal users of the area are people involved in raising cattle. A working ranch named San Antonio is located in sec. 18. The ruins of an old mill are located in sec. 20, and an abandoned stage coach stop is located in sec. 17. Peavine Creek which has intermittent water enters the township in sec. 5, drains generally in a SSW. direction, and leaves in sec. 18. Other drainage is provided by numerous washes draining predominantly in a westerly direction with much of the northern part of the townships runoff accumulating around San Antonio Ranch. Access is provided by an improved gravel road entering the township in sec. 4, bearing generally NE. and SW., and leaving in sec. 18. Numerous trail roads intersect with the improved gravel road. There are sand dunes located mainly in sec. 19.

No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
