Undergrowth, sagebrush and native grass.</p> <div>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</div> <p>The land within Township 23 North, Range 20 East, ranges from about 4,200 to 5,200 ft. above sea level. The soil in the area is sandy clay loam to rocky. The vegetation is sagebrush and native grass in the lower areas and sagebrush and scattered juniper in the mountains.</p> <p>There are numerous trail roads throughout the township, and an improved gravel road crosses through sections 22 and 27 in a southeasterly direction.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen, and the land east of this work is subdivided into ranchette subdivisions. There were mineral formations noted in secs. 22 and 27.</p>
