

RETRACEMENT AND REMONUMENTATION OF CERTAIN CORNERS OF

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The area surveyed and resurveyed within Township 19 North, Range 44 East, varies from mountainous in the west and south portions to nearly level in the northeast portion, with the remaining terrain being gently rolling. The elevation ranges from about 6,500 to 8,050 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay loam and rocky on the higher elevations to black loam on the level land. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, crested wheat grass, juniper and pinion pine. There are scattered stands of willow and cottonwood along Willow Creek and in Cahill Canyon.

Willow Creek crosses the NE. corner of the township from NW. to SE. There are springs in sections 21, 28 and 32.

U. S. Highway No. 50 crosses the area over Austin Summit and Scott Summit through the southern edge of the township. Grass Valley Road crosses the eastern edge of the township, intersecting U. S. Highway No. 50 in section 26. A power line crosses the northern tier of sections running E. and W. Further access is provided by numerous secondary and trail roads.

The western portion of the surveyed area is very highly mineralized. There are numerous mining claims in this area, but no active mining operations.

The principal users of the area are cattlemen. Wolfe Ranch is located in section 13 and Willow Creek Ranch is in section 12.

The town of Austin, Nevada is in section 19.
